SCHOOL DIARIES

All students have been issued with a Devon Intermediate Home and School Diary. The cost is \$9 which is payable to the school office. This diary is an important communication tool between home and school and we encourage parents/caregivers to write notes in it. It is also a key organisational tool in which students will record their homework and other reminders.

UNIFORM

The first meeting of the year will be held on Monday 16 February at 7pm in the staffroom. Come along and join us for coffee and cake.


SWIMMING PROGRAMME
