Term one brings with it a flurry of events including our standards swimming sports which will be held on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March as well as our Championships swimming sports which will be held on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> February. My thanks to all those parents who attended the Pathways and Planning meetings which were held prior to the start of school. I hope meetings were valuable to both you and your child and ensured that your child was comfortable about being at Devon and knew where they were going on their first day, as well as having some goals to aim for in the first part of the year.

We have scheduled a Teacher Only Day on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March which is the Friday prior to Taranaki Anniversary Weekend. The staff will be focusing on improving their teaching of Reading throughout 2019 which follows on from our two years of intensive professional development related to Writing.

# SCHOOL WEBSITE

Our school website is a valuable communication method. As well as the school newsletter, it also contains other important information about school and class events and activities. Class teachers will be regularly updating their class pages. We consider our website to be an important component of home and school communication and encourage you to visit it regularly.

#### SWIMMING PROGRAMME

Swimming is a compulsory component of the Physical Education curriculum and the focus of our Term 1 programme. It is important that students are prepared for swimming each day by having the appropriate swimwear. They need to bring named togs and towel. Goggles and/or rash shirts are optional. For safety reasons, students will not be permitted to be in the pool in shorts, tee shirts or other clothing. If there is a medical reason your child is unable to swim for the day, the appropriate section needs to be completed in the school diary.

#### UNIFORM

Remember that you should ensure all school uniform items are clearly marked with the student's name. We suggest that the sun hats are marked using a Twink pen. As part of the summer school uniform, all students are required to have a school navy, wide-brimmed or bucket hat. These hats are available from the school office for just \$10 each new, or second-hand \$5 each. Hair is expected to be neat and tidy – <u>no way-out styles or colours will be permitted.</u>
