SHINGLES

Please be advised, we have been made aware of a student diagnosed with Singles. If your child should display any of the following symptoms please keep them home and have them checked by a doctor as soon as possible.

Shingles is a painful rash that develops on one side of the face, body or head. The rash is made up of small blisters that typically scab over after 7–10 days.

Before the rash develops, people often have pain, itching or tingling in the area where the rash will develop. Although shingles can occur anywhere on your body, it most commonly occurs around the back or the upper abdomen or on the face. Usually the rash occurs in a stripe on either the left or the right side of the body. Less commonly, the rash can be more widespread. This generally occurs only in people with a weakened immune system. Other symptoms of shingles can include:

- Fever
- Chills
- Upset stomach
- Headache
