Over the next couple of weeks, we have immunisation catch-ups for those children who have signed documentation for this to be completed and MANA Reward Day. Also, now we are in the Orange zone, we are able to enjoy activities that were cancelled last year. Currently we are planning a sports exchange with Manukorihi Intermediate to be held at Devon on June 1st. A reminder that next Friday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>, we have a **Teacher Only Day** and there will be **No classes** for students. Progress is being made on the upgrades around the school. Adventure block are pleased to have access to their refurbished toilets and breakout rooms; and we are expecting rooms 20 and 21 to be completed in the next week or so. Many students prefer to wear sandals all year round; we are fine with that if they are regulation sandals.
