
BUS FARE CHANGES COMING SOON

- Adult fares will increase by 25%
- A one-way trip within zone one in New Plymouth will now be \$2.50 with a Bee Card.
- A one-way trip from Hāwera to New Plymouth will now be \$6.25 with a Bee Card.
- A new Youth fare is being introduced for passengers aged 5 to 18. Youth fares will see a smaller increase of 13.5%.
- A one-way trip within zone one in New Plymouth will now be \$2.25 with a Bee Card
- A one-way trip from Hāwera to New Plymouth will now be \$5.70 with a Bee Card.
